Temporary Services Contract and Temporary Staff Pay Rates Explanation: AppleOne has been asked by GWNC President to provide an updated range of pay based on temp staff's job descriptions and typical rates of pay for similar roles in October, 2023. To conform with the Brown Act's requirement that no funding motions exceed dollar amounts listed in the agendas, the placeholder motion below uses hypothetical maximums of \$50/hour; the quote from AppleOne is anticipated to be significantly lower. Possible Motion: the GWNC requests the City Clerk contract with Howroyd-Wright Agency, Inc., dba AppleOne Employment Services, for administrative assistant services from Julia Christiansen at a rate of pay not to exceed \$50/hour and a billable rate not to exceed \$50/hour and a billable rate not to exceed \$50/hour and a billable rate not to exceed \$50/hour, based on the provided scope of services (job descriptions) provided by the GWNC for each role.

No Motion was made or vote taken.

B. GWNC Business Cards & Badges

2. Possible Motion: The GWNC will allocate up to \$250 for the purchase of lanyard badges for its Directors from Anderson Trophy; and will reallocate \$250 from Rollover Funds to Office/Operational.

FUNDING MOTION (by Mr. D'Atri, seconded by Mr. Anderson: The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council will allocate up to \$250 for the purchase of lanyard badges for Jesseca Harvey, Selene Betancourt, MJ Anderson, Romi Cortier, Brian Curran, and Alex Nava; and will reallocate \$250 from Rollover Funds to Office/Operational.

FUNDING MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 15 eligible voters present with 13 in favor ("Yes" or "Aye") (Alpers, Anderson, Betancourt, Carpenter, Carroll, Chvatal, Cortier, D'Atri, DeVore, Gresham, Harvey, Sicilia and Smith); zero opposed; two abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither "yes" votes or "no" votes) (Meister and Starr).

C. Formation of Ad Hoc Neighborhood Purposes Grants Committee

MOTION (by Mr. D'Atri, seconded by Mr. Alpers) The GWNC forms a Neighborhood Purposes Grants Committee with Jesseca Harvey as Committee Chair and Ms. Chvatal-Keane, Ms. Betancourt, Ms. Carroll and Mr. Sicilia as members.

MOTION PASSED unanimously with all 15 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.

D. Selection of Community Impact Statement (CIS) Filers (up to 5)

1. Possible Motion: Be it resolved, that the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council authorizes the following board member(s) to SUBMIT Community Impact Statements which have been passed by a vote of the full board: Conrad Starr [and FILL IN UP TO 4 OTHERS]. Be it further resolved, in cases where an issue is moving quickly through the legislative process and a promptly issued statement is beneficial, the aforementioned board member(s) (is/are) authorized to also WRITE and SUBMIT Community Impact Statements which express positions previously voted upon by the full board.

Ms. DeVore and Ms. Chvatal-Keane agreed to be CIS filers in addition to Mr. Starr.

C. Possible Motion: The GWNC appoints Jennifer DeVore to be its Budget Representative of the NCBA (alongside Jack Humphreville).

MOTION (by Mr. Gresham, seconded by Mr. D'Atri): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council appoints Jennifer DeVore to be its Budget Representative of the NCBA (alongside Jack Humphreville).

MOTION PASSED unanimously with all 15 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.

D. Possible Motion to appoint a Board Member or Stakeholder to the Neighborhood Council Regional Grievance Panel.

Mr. Smith was willing to volunteer.

MOTION (by Mr. D'Atri, seconded by Ms. Chvatal): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council appoints Owen Smith to the Neighborhood Council Regional Grievance Panel.

MOTION PASSED with 14 in favor; zero opposed; one abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither "yes" votes or "no" votes) (Starr).

XV. COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENTS (CIS), RESOLUTIONS, REQUESTS FOR ACTION (Discussion and Possible Action)

A. Amendment to Rule 48 - Request for Action.. Possible Motion: the GWNC [_IF SAME WORDING AS MOTION, REPLACE THE FOLLOWING WITH "[see the below Motion]"] requests the City Council agendize and pass forthwith the following amendment to its current Rule 48: that so-called default voting be abandoned, that every Council Member must be physically present in their seat in the Council Chamber to count towards quorum, and must vote either "yes" or "no" or be indicated as "absent" and, under no circumstances, may a vote when the Councilmember is not physically in their seat be counted as anything other than "absent."

MOTION (by Ms. Betancourt, seconded by Ms. Chvatal): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council requests the City Council agendize and pass forthwith the following amendment to its

current Rule 48: that so-called default voting be abandoned, that every Council Member must be physically present in their seat in the Council Chamber to count towards quorum, and must vote either "yes" or "no" or be indicated as "absent" and, under no circumstances, may a vote when the Councilmember is not physically in their seat be counted as anything other than "absent."

MOTION PASSED unanimously with all 15 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.

Board Member John Gresham left at this time (8:44), making 14 Board Members present (the GWNC quorum is thirteen).

B. FY 2024/25 City Budget/Neighborhood Council Budget. Possible Motion: to file a CIS and or resolution/request for action requesting that Neighborhood Council budgets be raised to \$45,000 per year.

MOTION (by Mr. D'Atri, seconded by MJ Anderson): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council will file a CIS and/or resolution/request for action requesting that Neighborhood Council budgets be restored to \$42,000 per year given rising costs such as wages, venue rentals, funding for outreach, and to maintain the \$10,000 per year rollover provision.

MOTION PASSED unanimously with all 14 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.
