

Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council General Board Meeting Minutes, Wednesday, December 11, 2024 Minutes Approved February 2025

Pursuant to the October 6, 2023 enactment of California Senate Bill 411 (Portantino) and LA City Council approval on November 1, 2023, the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council meeting will be conducted virtually.

I. WELCOMING REMARKS

A. Call to Order, Welcoming Remarks (Conrad Starr).

A duly noticed Meeting of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council ("GWNC") Board of Directors was held online. President Conrad Starr called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and explained procedures, reminding Board Members to check with the City Attorney if the Member has a possible or definite conflict of interest.

B. Roll Call (Jennifer DeVore).

The Secretary called the roll. Fourteen of the 21 Board Members or their Alternate were present online at the Roll Call: MJ Anderson, Scott Appel, Selene Betancourt, Jeffry Carpenter, Cindy Chvatal-Keane, Romi Cortier, Mark Alpers/Brian Curran, Charles D'Atri (Vice-President), Jennifer DeVore (Secretary), Gary Gilbert, John Gresham, Jesseca Harvey (Assistant Secretary), Sixto Sicilia and Conrad Starr (President). Patricia Carroll (Treasurer) was not present at roll call but arrived later before any votes taken. 6 Board Members were absent and not represented by an Alternate: Andy Galan, Julie Kim, Rochelle Lewis, Benny Rosenberg, Anne Rudnick, Owen Smith. Tommy Atlee had resigned and was replaced by MJ Anderson. The GWNC Board quorum (the minimum number of Board Members needing to be present to take binding votes on Agendized Items) is 13 (see the Bylaws link at https://greaterwilshire.org/bylaws-board-rules), so the Board could take such votes. All 21 of the 21 Board Seats were filled (by election or appointment). No Board Seat(s) were vacant. Ten Alternate Seats were vacant [see Item #V. A.; to apply see www.GreaterWilshire.org]. Also attended: approximately 34 Stakeholders and guests.

II. GOVERNMENT REPORTS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

- A. Fifth Council District (Michelle Flores michelle.flores@lacity.org). Michelle Flores, a Field Deputy for L.A. City District Five Councilmember Katy Yaroslavsky [ofc. 213-473-7005; Michelle.Flores@LACity.org; https://councildistrict5.LACity.gov], reported that an additional \$60,000 was allocated for street lighting. The City Council approved to lower emissions from large buildings; exemptions are available.
- B. Thirteenth Council District (Karla Martinez karla.g.martinez@lacity.org). Karla Martinez, a Field Deputy for L.A. City District 13 Councilmember Hugo Soto-Martinez [213-473-7013; https://cd13.LACity.org], was not present; there was no report.

Danny Chavez, an Olympic Division Senior Lead Officer [office 213-382-9102; cell/text phone 213-793-0714 (the same as retired Officer Joe Pelayo); 36304@LAPD.Online], http://www.LAPDonline.org/olympic_community_police_station], reported. Many citations were issued regarding prostitution and traffic violations. Wheels are being stolen from vehicles, especially Toyotas, Hyundais and Hondas; he encouraged installing wheel locks. Lately, there've been more package thefts; he encouraged having packages delivered to a secure location. There've been sliding door burglary entries.

Hebel Rodriguez, an LAPD Wilshire Division Senior Lead Officer [office 213-473-0476; cell/text phone 213-793-0715; 35738@LAPD.Online;

https://www.LAPDOnline.org/lapd-contact/west-bureau/wilshire-community-police-statio n], reported that burglaries, robberies and car thefts in his Basic Car Area have significantly decreased. He noted that burglary crews are still operating. Assaults are slightly increased. Also, many of the Larchmont Blvd. median vehicle parkers are delivery drivers. He said "we will continue to provide extra patrol for that area."

- 2. No Confidence Vote / Poor Attendance
 - a) DESCRIPTION: Under Article V, Section 7 of the GWNC Bylaws: "Poor Attendance' is when a Director misses three (3) consecutive Board meetings. If a Director misses three (3) consecutive Board meetings, the Director shall be deemed suspended, and shall not be entitled to vote or speak on any matter except as provided in this paragraph. The Secretary shall then have the matter placed on the agenda for a vote of the Board at the next regular meeting of the Board. A vote of "No Confidence" by two-thirds (2/3) of the entire number of the Board shall be necessary to remove the identified Board member forthwith. The Director who is the subject of the removal action shall not take part in the vote on the matter, but will be allowed to speak at the Board meeting prior to the vote. If an adequate number of Board Directors are not present to pass a motion for removal, the matter shall be placed on the agenda for the next regular meeting, and every meeting thereafter, until such time as a vote is taken. A Board-approved removal under this section shall be effective upon passage, and the Director's position shall be deemed vacated. The suspension of a Director pursuant to this section shall remain in effect until (a) his or her removal becomes effective, or (b) a vote of "No Confidence" on his or her removal fails, or (c) his or her term expires."

The GWNC Religion Representative was absent from consecutive GWNC Regular Board Meetings on July 10, August 14, September 11, and October 9, 2024.

Ms. Chvatal reported that Benny Rosenberg resigned. Ms. Chvatal will request Mr. Rosenberg to send an email to Mr. Starr.

b) CITY OF LOS ANGELES. Possible Motion: The GWNC removes from the Board its Religion Representative, Benny Rosenberg, by a vote of no confidence, due to poor attendance.

The above Motion was not needed.

VIII. <u>LAND USE COMMITTEE</u> (Discussion and possible action) A. Committee Report - Chair: Brian Curran.

B. 531 N. Larchmont Blvd: (Atabak Youssefzadeh) Construction, use, and maintenance of a 67 unit, 6-story, mixed use - 100% affordable housing project with no residential parking. Case No: PAR-2024-6447-VHCA-RED1. Zoning: [Q]C2-1VL. Area7: Larchmont; CD13. Possible Motion: [see the below Motion].

Mr. Alpers explained the project. Resident Sam Uretsky, representing project-abutting neighbors, reported that "we've tried to engage with the architect three times."

MOTION (Mr. Alpers, Mr. D'Atri): With reference to Case File PAR-2024-6447-VHCA-RED1, a proposed 6-story, 71.5-foot tall, 68-unit, zero tenant-parking, RED1 project at 531 N. Larchmont Boulevard; as this project is currently in pre-approval by the LA City Planning Department and the Housing Department, the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council opposes the project at this time and requests that the property owner and architect meet with neighbors likely to be impacted by this project to further discuss their concerns.

Mr. D'Atri described "comprises by the community" while the developer "made some real concessions," however, "the developer has turned around" in an "egregious" way. Mr. Anderson thought "the project still has merit." Some Board Members believed that not enough parking would be provided. Mr. Uretsky reported that City Councilmember Soto-Martinez believed that the project is too tall and that the developer has not negotiated in good faith. Many neighbors expressed concerns about parking, crowding and neighbors' privacy.

Board Member Patti Carroll had stepped away by this time, making **14** Board Members present (the GWNC Board quorum is thirteen).

MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 14 eligible voters present with 11 in favor ("Yes" or "Aye") (Alpers, Appel, Carpenter, Chvatal, Cortier, D'Atri, DeVore, Gilbert, Gresham, Harvey, Sicilia); one opposed ("No" or "Nay") (Anderson); two abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither "yes" votes or "no" votes) (Betancourt and Starr).

C. 5200 Wilshire / 788 S. La Brea Ave. ("The Night We Met"): (Nick Leathers) Filing date: 8/06/24. Plan Approval to allow the continued sale and dispensing of a full line of alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption in conjunction with a 3,434 sf restaurant with cocktail lounge. Case no:

CPC-2008-9909-GPA-CUB-HD-BL-SPR-ZAD-CDO-PA3. Zoning: [Q]C4-2D-CDO. Area 11: Sycamore Square; CD 5. Possible Motion: The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council [see the below Motion].

Mr. Alpers reported that the applicant requested more time. Mr. Leathers said they "would still like to pursue a 2 a.m. closure; that's our only" request. Mr. Alpers described the project's parking. Some live entertainment would be inside.

MOTION (by Mr. Alpers, seconded by MJ Anderson): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council supports the Plan Approval (Case no: CPC-2008-9909-GPA-CUB-HD-BL-SPR-ZAD-CDO-PA3) to allow the continued sale and dispensing of a full line of alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption in conjunction with a 3,434 sf restaurant with cocktail lounge located at 788 S. La Brea Ave., with the conditions that there be no outdoor live entertainment and that the hours of operation be from 11:00 a.m.- 12:00 a.m., as presented to the GWNC Land Use Committee on November 26, 2024.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Leathers requested that, if the Board doesn't agree with the hours, he would present to the next LUC meeting.

Board Member Patti Carroll returned _/ arrived at this time (8:15), making 14 Board Members present (the GWNC quorum is thirteen).

MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 15 eligible voters present with 11 in favor ("Yes" or "Aye") (Alpers, Anderson, Appel, Carroll, Chvatal, Cortier, D'Atri, DeVore, Gresham, Harvey and Sicilia); zero opposed; four abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither "yes" votes or "no" votes) (Betancourt, Carpenter, Gilbert and Starr).
