V. OLD BUSINESS (Discussion and Possible Action)

A. Discussion of impacts of pesticides on human health, specifically cancer and Parkinson's. Report by Dr. Anders Waalen. Followed by discussion of how to minimize use of pesticides on Wilshire Country Club golf course upgrade. BACKGROUND: Several GWNC residents have contacted GWNC to determine if the Wilshire Country Club will be using herbicides on the new golf course and if they could use more native plants on site. The impact of herbicides on human health is a topic of current research, see the May, 2025 JAMA article "Proximity to Golf Courses and Risk of Parkinson Disease.

"We are communicating with Katie Tilford, Theodore Payne Foundation, to see if she could speak at our next Sustainability Committee meeting.

Dr. Anders Waalen gave a brief review of the literature on links betweenpesticides and cancers and pesticides and Parkinson's Disease. The use of organic pesticides was discussed. The role of LA City Council or LA County in limiting the level of allowable pesticides was discussed. An action plan was discussed to understand this topic better and to develop motions that could be proposed to the Board for their approval. Working with other environmental and sustainability groups in Los Angeles, such as the NCSA, was discussed.

Two motions were proposed:

Motion: The GWNC Board approves the ESC to contact the Wilshire Country Club to discuss the on-going renovation of the golf course and potentially schedule an in-person visit for an more detailed discussion of the use of pesticides and fertilizers during renovation and afterwards.

This motion passed unanimously.

Motion: In order to further the discussion on the use of pesticides and fertilizers on public parks, the GWNC Board approves the ESC to contact the LANCC to determine if other NC have raised similar concerns.

This motion passed unanimously.
