IV. NEW BUSINESS (Discussion and Possible Action)

A. Submission of letters to CD2-Nazarian and CD14-Jurado City Councilmembers requesting a meeting regarding the use of pesticides.

BACKGROUND: In 2025, several GWNC residents contacted GWNC regarding new reports linking pesticides to Parkinson's and other diseases. On 10/16/2025, the GWNC ESC invited a subject matter expert, Dr. Beate Ritz, to speak at the ESC meeting. As a result of that meeting, the ESC requested meetings to be set up with CD5 and CD13 Councilmembers or their staff to discuss the growing research tying pesticide use and human illness and the possibility of reducing or banning pesticides in LA city public property. The council members' staff suggest speaking to other members of the City Council who are on the Energy & Environment Committee and/or oversee the Department of Recreation & Parks. We would therefore like to expand the discussion to include these additional City Council members in an effort to build momentum toward change.

- i. **Possible Motion:** The GWNC ESC approves the attached letter requesting an opportunity to meet with Council Members Adrin Nazarian, CD-2, and Ysabel Jurado, CD-14 and/or their staff members to discuss the topic of pesticide use on City-controlled properties and to review the research the ESC has collected for discussion at the GWNC Board and transmission to the CD 2 and CD 14 City Councilmembers.

It wasn’t some ‘storm of the century.’ And it wasn’t climate change, and don’t let anybody try to tell you otherwise.](#)” See the [video](#) at 34:00. Many other comments could and should be made about this rally, but for the moment, let us remind the councilmember that, as is the case with many horrific events, the **Palisades fire** has a complex set of causes—the **climate crisis** being one of them, and that, as a leader of her community, she has a lot of influence, and that with such influence comes great responsibility. We ignore the role of **climate change** at our peril.
- v. **Santa Monica leaves the door open for no more artificial turf.** The Santa Monica City Council, instead of voting to replace existing **artificial turf** with more of the same (like for like), [voted instead to consider natural alternatives](#) at the end of the artificial turf lifespan, when more research should be available.

VIRTUAL MEETING TELECONFERENCING INSTRUCTIONS / PUBLIC INPUT AT NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETINGS – Every person wishing to address the Board/Committee must dial (669) 900-6833 or (877) 853-5257 and enter 928 2781 1179 then press # to join the meeting. [The Department of Neighborhood Empowerment maintains that this language is required, although it's also possible to address the board or committee using the Zoom app. In other words, it's not true that you "must" dial in. Please see the Zoom instructions below and the link on Page 1 of this agenda.]

The GWNC shall make reasonable efforts to accommodate any member of the public that requests an accommodation to participate in the meeting, by providing a publicly accessible physical location for the member of the public to participate from, providing access to technology necessary to participate in the meeting, or identifying locations or resources available that could provide the member of the public with an opportunity to participate in the meeting.

To address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes action on that item, the public is requested, when prompted by the chairperson, to dial *9 (if connecting by phone) or press the "raise hand" button (if using the Zoom app). Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda but which are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. The Board is prevented from acting on a matter brought to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, it may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to two minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the chairperson.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).**

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).**

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5).**

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6(A)).**

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to

provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).**
