



Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council
General Board Meeting Minutes, Wednesday, April 15, 2026
Approved May 13, 2026

Pursuant to the October 6, 2023 enactment of California Senate Bill 707 (Portantino) and LA City Council approval on November 1, 2023, the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council meeting will be conducted virtually.

I. WELCOMING REMARKS

A. Call to Order, Welcoming Remarks (GWNC President).

A duly noticed Meeting of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council (“GWNC”) Board of Directors was held online. President Jennifer DeVore called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. and explained procedures, reminding Board Members to check with the City Attorney if the Member has a possible or definite conflict of interest.

B. Roll Call (GWNC Secretary).

Secretary Stuart called the roll. Twenty of the 21 Board Members were present online at the Roll Call: Mark Alpers, MJ Anderson, Scott Appel, Patti Carroll (Treasurer), Romi Cortier, Brian Curran, Charles D’Atri, Julia Dalton, Jennifer DeVore (President), Slate Donaldson, Richard Gano, Gary Gilbert, Tony Gittelsohn, John Gresham (Vice-President), Natalie Irby, Drew Kiesow, Lisha Sevanian, Sixto Sicilia, Conrad Starr and Erika Stuart (Secretary). Dave Cavalier was absent and not represented by an Alternate. Area 13 Wilshire Park Alternate Kathy Becker was appointed to the Board during below Item #V.

C. 1. b. Alternate Diana Yin Breaker resigned. The GWNC Board quorum (the minimum number of Board Members needing to be present to take binding votes on Agendized Items) is 13 (see the Bylaws link at <https://greaterwilshire.org/bylaws-board-rules>), so the Board could take such votes. All of the 21 Board Seats were filled (by election or appointment). No Board Seat was vacant. Six Alternate Seats were vacant [see Item #V. C. 1. a.; to apply see www.GreaterWilshire.org]. Also attended: approximately 14 Stakeholders and guests.

II. GOVERNMENT REPORTS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

A. Council District 5 - (Michelle Flores - michelle.flores@lacity.org).

Michelle Flores, a Field Deputy for L.A. City District Five Councilmember Katy Yaroslavsky [ofc. 213-473-7005; Michelle.Flores@LACity.org; <https://councildistrict5.LACity.gov>], reported on upcoming events.

Mark Fuentes, Senior Field Deputy for L.A. City District 13 Councilmember Hugo Soto-Martinez [213-993-2991; <https://cd13.LACity.org>], reported on street light repairs.
- C. LAPD Olympic & Wilshire Divisions (SLOs Cho 33817@lapd.online & Chavez 36304@lapd.online (Olympic), Rodriguez 35738@lapd.online and Shuck 40740@lapd.online (Wilshire)) and Officer Andrew Jones 41719@lapd.online (8th Street to Olympic, La Brea to Mansfield).
Harry Cho, an LAPD Olympic Division Senior Lead Officer [office 213-382-9102; cell/text phone 213-793-0649; 33817@LAPD.Online; http://www.LAPDOnline.org/olympic_community_police_station], reported that, in Wilshire Park, a camera was hidden in bushes “to capture the resident’s going in and out of the house . . . watching the driveway and the front door.” Police are investigating. He requested that homeowners check landscaping for cameras, including asking gardeners to check. He reminded to close and secure windows and doors before leaving home, including on second and third stories. There’ve been increased package thefts; he reminded to have packages delivered to a locker or other address. He thanked people for their fundraising support.
- Hebel Rodriguez, an LAPD Wilshire Division Senior Lead Officer [office 213-473-0476; cell/text phone 213-793-0715; 35738@LAPD.Online; <https://www.LAPDOnline.org/lapd-contact/west-bureau/wilshire-community-police-station>], reported on a 40% year-to-date increase in robberies in his area; some may have been by a robbery crew hitting multiple Metro PCS stores. Several of the crew, some juveniles, some adults, have been “taken into custody.” He explained the difference between a “theft” and a “robbery.” A theft is elevated to a robbery when force or fear is used by the thief. There’d been an 11% year-to-date increase in thefts and a 50% year-to-date decrease in burglaries. He thanked people for the carnival turnout.

Dept. of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) [213-978-1551; www.EmpowerLA.org], reported on the Saturday, June 6th Youth Conference at downtown City Hall; she encouraged to have youth apply to attend. Budget Day will be June 27th, 7:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. with panel discussions and workshops. She will provide a corrected GWNC map; both DONE and the City Clerk working on it; they “hope to have it . . . within the next month.” DONE is working on new website accessibility requirements.

B.] Ms. Cervantes, Central Area Representative for Mayor Karen Bass [213-978-3130; <http://LAMayor.org>], reported that solar street lights were being installed, and on legislation addressing “heavy metal theft,” including copper wire. Many potholes were filled with the help of many 3-1-1 requests.

VII. TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE (Discussion and possible action)

A. Committee Report - Chair: Romi Cortier.

B. Traffic Safety Motions (Discussion and Possible Action).

1. Clinton and Larchmont (Possible Motion): [see the below Motion].

MOTION (by Mr. Cortier, seconded by Mr. Alpers): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council moves the following:
WHEREAS, the intersection of N. Larchmont Blvd. and Clinton St. has been identified by stakeholders to the GWNC Transportation Committee as a dangerous intersection requiring urgent safety interventions, and

WHEREAS, this intersection is the site of at least four documented, serious vehicular accidents since November 2025 alone, including one accident on March 8, 2026, that resulted in damages to the POLAM Credit Union located at 589 N. Larchmont Blvd. (southwest corner of this intersection) estimated to cost approximately \$1 million dollars for repairs, and:

WHEREAS, this intersection is proximate to the Page Academy, located at 565 N. Larchmont Blvd., and represents a constant and continuing hazard to students and parents arriving and departing by vehicle or on foot, or standing on the adjacent sidewalk, and:

WHEREAS, persistent speeding along the corridor of Upper Larchmont Blvd. (between Melrose Ave. and Beverly Blvd.) continues to compromise the safety of local residents, pedestrians and business patrons;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the GWNC Board requests that Council District 13 Council Member Hugo Soto-Martinez exercise the full authority of his office to coordinate with the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to:

1 – Implement Safety Upgrades at the Intersection: Execute immediate safety enhancements, both temporary and permanent, at N. Larchmont Blvd. and Clinton Street that are developed in consultation with, and acceptable to, the neighboring residents and businesses.

2 – Deploy Speed Mitigation Measures: Fund and install physical traffic-calming infrastructure along the full length of Upper Larchmont Blvd. (Melrose Ave. to Beverly Blvd.). Options to be evaluated include, but are not limited to:

- Physical Obstacles: Installation of speed humps or speed tables.
- ALPR Speed Cameras: Installation and Maintenance
- Road Diet/Reconfiguration: Implementation of center-median diagonal parking to effectively reduce moving traffic to a single lane in each direction.

3 – Increase Enforcement & Priority: Request LAPD to increase traffic enforcement in this corridor and designate these projects for accelerated priority status within the City’s infrastructure pipeline.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the GWNC Board requests a formal status update from CD 13 regarding the feasibility and timeline of their requests at the Board's next meeting on May 21, 2026.

Resident Sam Uretsky gave further information.

AMENDED MOTION (by Ms. Irby, seconded by MJ Anderson): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council, after the above Main Motion final paragraph that begins with “BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,” adds the following paragraph to the end of the Motion:

“And be it further resolved that the GWNC Board authorizes Business Representative and Transportation Committee Chair Romi Cortier to apply for grant funding from the City of Los Angeles Innovation and Performance Commission in time for such grants to be placed on the Commission's agenda for its May 20, 2026 meeting, for amounts to be determined, for: 1. Procurement and

testing of 4–6 LED-illuminated solar-powered stop signs for this intersection; and 2. A feasibility study of two-sided center median nose-end parking on Larchmont Boulevard between Beverly Boulevard and Melrose Avenue, including striping of one pilot section extending southward from the planted center median on the 500 North block of Larchmont Boulevard to approximately in line with the northern lot line of the Larchmont Medical Building, while keeping all current parallel parking spaces.”

AMENDED MOTION PASSED unanimously by a hand vote of the 20 eligible voters present with all 20 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.

2. John Burroughs (Possible Motion) : The GWNC Boards requests that the Mayor add increased funding for traffic safety and enforcement surrounding the John Burroughs Middle School and will send a letter to that effect to the Mayor’s office and to CD5.

VIII. PUBLIC SAFETY & QUALITY OF LIFE COMMITTEE (Discussion and Possible Action)

FUNDING MOTION (by Mr. Gittelsohn, seconded by Mr. Gilbert): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council will hold a Public Safety Town Hall on September 27,

2026, focused on public safety and emergency preparedness, with City and County departments/offices and others to present and provide information at tables, with a preliminary budget of up to \$1,780, per the attached documentation.

AMENDMENT to the MOTION (by Mr. Gittelson, seconded by Mr. D’Atri): Based on the 4/6/26 recommendation of the Public Safety / Quality of Life (PSQL) Committee, the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council (GWNC) Board authorizes the formation of a small working group, to be led by Tony Gittelson and Gary Gilbert, to study the feasibility, and organize, a GWNC Public Safety/Emergency Preparedness Town Hall to be held on Sunday, September 27, 2026, at John Burroughs Middle School.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Gittelson described his outreach to at least 50 neighbors. The Town Hall would be from 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.; CD5 and 13 and other government representatives will attend. This Motion would be a “preliminary approval” by the GWNC to apply for Permits. Mr. Starr explained the usual Permit approval process.

Board Member Julia Dalton was unavailable or had left by this time, making 19 Board Members present (the GWNC Board quorum is thirteen).

AMENDMENT to the MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 19 eligible voters present with eight in favor (“Yes” or “Aye”) (Anderson, Curran, D’Atri, Gano, Gilbert, Gittelson, Sevanian and Sicilia); four opposed (“No” or “Nay”) (Carroll, Cortier, Gresham and Starr); seven abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither “yes” votes or “no” votes) (Alpers, Appel, DeVore, Donaldson, Irby, Kiesow and Stuart).

Board Member Drew Kiesow left at this time (8:30), making 18 Board Members present (the GWNC Board quorum is thirteen).

DISCUSSION: Mr. Gittelson said that Burroughs Middle School is “the least expensive” location; Marlborough was “unavailable.” Mr. Gresham suggested to TABLE this item.

MOTION to REFER to COMMITTEE (by Mr. Gresham, seconded by Mr. Starr): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council refers Item #VIII. C. to the Public Safety & Quality Of Life Committee.

MOTION to REFER to COMMITTEE PASSED by a hand vote of the 18 eligible voters present with 17 in favor; zero opposed; one abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither “yes” votes or “no” votes) (Gittelson).

D. Council File 25-0848 (AB 747 / City Compliance Status / Existing Evacuation Plans / Improve Evacuation Route Infrastructure) (Park/Yaroslavsky) (Background: California Assembly Bill 747 (AB 747), effective January 1, 2022, requires local jurisdictions to update their General Plan Safety Elements to identify and analyze evacuation routes, assess their capacity, and evaluate their viability under various emergency scenarios, such as wildfires. This legislation ensures cities and counties plan for, and test,

evacuation strategies, often incorporating them into local Hazard Mitigation Plans or Emergency Operations Plans.) Motion: The GWNC will file a Community Impact Statement (CIS) in support of [“for”] Council File 25-0848.

Mr. Starr explained the Motion.

MOTION (by Mr. Starr, seconded by Mr. D’Atri): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council will file a Community Impact Statement (CIS) in support of [“for”] Council File 25-0848.

MOTION PASSED unanimously by a hand vote of the 18 eligible voters present with all 18 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.

C. 600 S. La Brea Ave. (& 6th): (Mike Obogeanu) Filing date: 3/18/25. CUB to sell a full line of alcohol for on-site consumption in conjunction with a new 5,707 sf restaurant having 324 total seats. Hours of operation: 7am-2am, daily. Case no: ZA-2025-1630-CUB. Zoning: C2-1. Area 6: La Brea-Hancock; CD 5. Possible Motion: The GWNC Council [see the below Motion].

Mr. Alpers noted the above. Mr. Starr corrected “LaBrea-Hancock Neighborhood Association” to LaBrea-Hancock Homeowners Association.”

MOTION (by Mr. Alpers, seconded by Ms. Stuart): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council opposes the proposed restaurant at 600 S. La Brea Ave., Case #ZA-2025-1630-CUB, unless the following conditions are incorporated into the CUB:

- 1) That the Permit limit the hours of operation to 8 a.m.–11 p.m. Sundays through Thursdays, and 8 a.m.-midnight Fridays and Saturdays;
- 2) That the applicant provide a security guard between 7 p.m. and closing time;
- 3) That the applicant be required to convene an annual meeting with the LaBrea-Hancock Homeowners Association and other interested parties to discuss community concerns;
- 4) That the applicant provide valet parking service between 5 p.m. and closing time, daily; and
- 5) No amplified sound is to be allowed on the patio or outside the interior of the restaurant at any time.

MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 17 eligible voters present with 14 in favor (“Yes” or “Aye”) (Alpers, Anderson, Carroll, Cortier, Curran, Donaldson, Gano, Gilbert, Gresham, Irby, Sevanian, Sicilia, Starr and Stuart); two opposed (“No” or “Nay”) (Appel and Gittelson); one abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither “yes” votes or “no” votes) (DeVore).

C. 300 N. La Brea Ave. (& Beverly): (Gary Benjamin) Filing date: 1/26/26. Demo of an existing 7,224 sf. shopping center and the construction of a new 66,901 sf., 7-story, 100% affordable housing development with 99 dwelling units, including (30) studio units, (59) one-bedroom units, and (10) two-bedroom units, with 78 Low Income units, 20 Moderate Income units, and one market-rate Manager's Unit, as well as 3,200 sf. of retail space on a 15,088 sf. lot. The project also includes (47) residential automobile parking spaces and 1,023 sf. of common open space. Case no: EAR-2026-350-AH-PHP-VHCA. Zoning: C2-1VL. Area 8: Melrose; CD 5. Possible Motion: The GWNC [see the below Motion].

Mr. Alpers added information.

MOTION (by Mr. Alpers, seconded by Mr. Starr): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council opposes the proposed affordable housing project at 300 N. La Brea Ave., Case #EAR-2026-350-AH-PHP-VHCA, unless the following conditions are incorporated into the Permit:

- 1) no amplified sound at any time on the roof deck;
- 2) no rental of the roof deck;
- 3) roof deck use hours of 10 a.m.-9 p.m. daily;
- 4) no rental of parking spaces other than to residential tenants;
- 5) no subletting of parking spaces by residential tenants;
- 6) applicant shall conduct outreach to the Melrose and Citrus Square neighbors; and
- 7) until the applicant clarifies what improvements will be made to the alleyway to allow for access and egress to tenant parking.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Alpers added information. Mr. Gittelson said that noise from large apartment buildings “simply isn’t a factor.” Mr. Alpers explained that the Motion doesn’t oppose the project.

MOTION PASSED by a hand vote with 15 in favor; one opposed (“No” or “Nay”) (Gittelson); one abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither “yes” votes or “no” votes) (Anderson).

MOTION to EXTEND the MEETING (by Mr. Gresham, seconded by Mr. Gittelson): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council will extend this meeting 20 minutes to 9:20 p.m.

MOTION to EXTEND the MEETING PASSED unanimously by a hand vote of all 17 eligible voters present; zero opposed; zero abstained.

MOTION (by Mr. Starr, seconded by MJ Anderson): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council moves the following:

WHEREAS the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council (GWNC) previously voted to support the recommendations to the Charter Reform Commission (CRC) from the Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition (LANCC) and the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC); and WHEREAS many of those recommendations were adopted by the CRC and included in their final report to City Council (“Report” - see https://cityclerk.lacity.org/onlinedocs/2026/26-0489_misc_CRC_4-2-26.pdf);

THEREFORE the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council resolves to file a Community Impact Statement on CF 26-0489 (neutral) expressing its support for the inclusion of all CRC recommendations pertaining to Neighborhood Councils in the Charter Reforms to be included in the November 2026 ballot before voters, recommendations which include:

- Expand Section 908 to clarify Neighborhood Councils' advisory role, outreach responsibility, community engagement authority, and representation function;
- Permit statements to governmental agencies passed in Brown Act meetings:
“Neighborhood Councils may deliver to any governmental agency a statement with respect to legislation proposed to or pending before that agency related to the purpose of Neighborhood Councils which is to promote more civic participation in government and make government more responsive to local needs, adopted through a majority vote at a publicly noticed Neighborhood Council Board meeting. The City may, by ordinance, create and require language to indicate the Neighborhood Council is speaking on behalf of that specific Neighborhood Council and not the City.”;
- Require remote participation options at City Council and commission meetings:
“The [City] Council shall provide an opportunity for Neighborhood Councils to comment via telephone or online teleconferencing at all regular and special meetings of the Council and any Council committees.” “Each Board and

commission that is a legislative body within the meaning of the Ralph M. Brown Act, whether created in the Charter or by ordinance or resolution, shall provide an opportunity for Neighborhood Councils to comment via telephone or online teleconferencing at all regular and special meetings”;

- Establish a separate queue for Neighborhood Councils to deliver Community Impact Statements at City Council and Council Committee meetings, distinct from general public comment:

“Neighborhood Councils delivering a Community Impact Statement to a Board and commission that is a legislative body within the meaning of the Ralph M. Brown Act, whether created in the Charter or by ordinance or resolution, shall be in a separate queue from public comment.”;

- Allow consent calendars on Neighborhood Council agendas, which may include common agenda items including, but not limited to, approval of minutes, the Monthly Expenditure Report, and action items that have been approved at a committee meeting;
- Provide Neighborhood Councils the opportunity to submit questions for DONE General Manager candidates during the employment interview;
- Increase the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners from seven to nine members, with two at-large commissioners appointed by Neighborhood Councils;
- Require completion of all required training for all Neighborhood Commissioners within 30 days for voting eligibility; and
- Allow Neighborhood Councils to submit budget requests through BONC chair.

DISCUSSION: Guest Lionel Mares appreciated the Committee’s work.

MOTION PASSED unanimously by a hand vote with all 16 in favor; zero opposed; zero abstained.
