I. WELCOMING REMARKS

A. Call to Order, Welcoming Remarks (GWNC President).

A duly noticed Meeting of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council (“GWNC”) Board of Directors was held at the Ebell of Los Angeles, 743 S. Lucerne Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90005. Secretary Erika Stuart called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m. and explained procedures, reminding Board Members to check with the City Attorney if the Member has a possible or definite conflict of interest.

B. Roll Call (GWNC Secretary).

The Secretary called the roll. MJ Anderson and Charles D’Atri arrived later. Scott Appel, Brian Curran, Jennifer DeVore (President), Richard Gano, Gary Gilbert and Lisha Sevanian were absent and not represented by an Alternate. The GWNC Board quorum (the minimum number of Board Members needing to be present to take binding votes on Agendized Items) is 13 (see the Bylaws link at <https://greaterwilshire.org/bylaws-board-rules>), so the Board could take such votes. All of the 21 Board Seats were filled (by election or appointment). No Board Seat was vacant. Five Alternate Seats were vacant [see Item #V. B. 1. a.; to apply see www.GreaterWilshire.org]. C. SB 79 Implementation Update: Discussion of proposed ordinances prepared by the City Planning Department to implement SB 79 Option C1, which include the Low-Rise Ordinance and the Phased Implementation Ordinance. The Planning Commission has scheduled a hearing on these ordinances for May 14, 2026. Possible Motion: The GWNC [see the below Motion].

Mr. Alpers explained the Motion.

MOTION (by Mr. Alpers, seconded by Ms. Carroll): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council opposes the Planning Department's current recommendations for the implementation of SB 79, with specific focus on the arbitrary reduction of rear setbacks and the lack of transparency regarding permanent rezoning. The GWNC further resolves to:

1. Demand Data-Driven Planning: Call upon the Planning Department and the Planning Commission to provide data justifying why a reduction from 15-foot to 4-foot rear setbacks is necessary, given that local studies show SB 79 requirements can be met under existing setback standards. This proposed reduction makes no sense since the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), which mandates a 15-foot rear yard and 5-foot side yards for multi-family zones like RD1.5, R3, and R4. The Department attempts to justify this reduction by citing Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) standards which allow 4 ft setbacks. ADUs were intended as small, secondary units and not multi-story buildings with far greater occupancy and risk. There is no justification to apply the same standards.
2. Oppose Permanent Rezoning via Overlays: Formally object to any implementation strategy that results in permanent density increases that cannot be reversed should SB 79 be repealed or modified, as this bypasses the standard public input process for rezoning. We ask that the implementation of SB 79 is not a rezoning nor an overlay, but an incentive that must be revocable if SB 79 is repealed or amended to a lower density and/or a revised definition of a qualifying transit stop.
3. Formal Opposition for May 14th Meeting: Submit this motion and supporting technical evidence to the Planning Commission prior to the May 14th meeting to ensure the Planning Commission is aware of the community's opposition and the viable alternatives that maintain 15-foot setbacks.

4. Authorized Distribution: That the City authorize the immediate distribution of educational materials and graphics to our membership to ensure residents are fully informed of the physical impacts of these proposals.
5. Exempt HPOZs: Clarify language in the Phased Implementation Ordinance and Low-Rise Ordinance to explicitly exempt HPOZs without qualification.
6. Community Impact: Preservation of neighborhood infrastructure, privacy, safety in light of recent historic fires that have taken place in and around LA, and local land-use control.

AMENDMENT to the MOTION (by Ms. Carroll, seconded by Mr. Alpers): The Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council revises above #6 to be #7, and inserts the following as new #6: “6. Proposed Amendment to allow 4-story multi-family buildings in residential zones subject to SB 79: The GWNC opposes a last-minute motion introduced by City Council Members Raman and Soto-Martinez for consideration by the Planning Commission at its May 14, 2026 meeting. This amendment reargues the height authorized under SB 79 phased implementation by allowing four story multi-family buildings in residential areas if the developer provides the least possible amount of affordable housing. This motion changes the rules of the game for implementing SB 79 as adopted by the City Council on March 24, 2026. These rules limited multi-family development to three stories in SB 79 residential areas. The one or two affordable units required by this motion would be inconsequential in meeting the State’s mandated affordable housing needs, particularly when contrasted with the additional height and density intrusions that this motion introduces, with no evidentiary basis, at this time into existing, thriving, one- and two-story residential neighborhoods.”

Board Member Julie Kim left at this time (7:33), making 14 Board Members present (the GWNC Board quorum is thirteen).

DISCUSSION: Mr. Alpers further explained. Resident Sam Uretsky thanked the Committee for its work.

AMENDMENT to the MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 13 eligible voters present with 12 in favor (“Yes” or “Aye”) ((Alpers, Anderson, Boyle, Carroll, Cohen, Cortier, D’Atri, Dalton, Donaldson, Sicilia, Starr and Stuart); one opposed (“No” or “Nay”) (Gittelson); zero abstained. One (Becker) was ineligible to vote due to not having completed one or more of the required trainings and/or not having signed the Code of Conduct.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Sicilia believed that SB 79 would destroy neighborhoods and that it was an infringement of people’s property rights.. Mr. Alpers said that vacancy rates are landlords’ propriety information. MJ Anderson said that change is necessary. Mr. Gittelson believed that density was needed around train stations.

AMENDED MOTION PASSED by a roll call vote of the 13 eligible voters present with 10 in favor (“Yes” or “Aye”) (Alpers, Boyle, Carroll, Cohen, Cortier, D’Atri, Dalton,

Sicilia, Starr and Stuart); two opposed (“No” or “Nay”) (Anderson and Donaldson); one abstained (the GWNC counts abstentions as neither “yes” votes or “no” votes) (Gittelsohn). One (Becker) was ineligible to vote due to not having completed one or more of the required trainings and/or not having signed the Code of Conduct.

One (Becker) was ineligible to vote due to not having completed one or more of the required trainings and/or not having signed the Code of Conduct.
