# A. Proposed wireless telecommunications facility at 407 S. Gramercy.

**Issue:** Originally supported by both LUC and Board, matter was sent back to LUC for reconsideration due to tenant opposition. Facility would be located on top of an existing apartment building and screened behind a façade to resemble the structure (arched recessed windows, etc.). Applicant notes customer demand for greater wireless service and a lack of nearby options on commercial properties. Residents and neighbors raised concerns about locating the facility on a residential structure, and compatibility with the historic apartment building.

**Suggested Motion**: That the GWNC Board support the neighbors in opposing the proposal for a wireless telecommunications tower on a residential building as proposed.
