REQUEST: Site Plan Review for an eldercare facility with more than 50 new residential units. REQUEST: Removal of outdated Building Line on Gramercy Drive. Applicant revised plans to adjust height on north facing façade as well as other street-level improvements. APCC-2017-569, ENV-2017-570-EAF. The Land Use Committee voted 7-0-0 to recommend that the Board support the project. **Proposed motion:** That the Board of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council support the

application for an Eldercare Facility Unified Permit at 3377 W. Olympic Blvd.

If adopted, this ordinance will better ensure that the City is a responsible steward of the Measure HHH funds, providing a streamlined pathway for the consideration of PSH projects while also imposing new regulations which establish stronger development standards for qualifying projects.
