AA-2017-5342-PMLA-SL, ENV-2017-5343-CE. The applicants provided the documentation on their outreach and The LUC voted to support the project. Proposed Motion: The LUC recommends that the Board of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council support the Preliminary Parcel Map for a Small Lot Subdivision at 4827 W. Oakwood Ave.
- C. 4817 W. Elmwood Ave: (Discussion and Possible Action) (Jack Moses)

  Construction of 2 new duplex buildings, each with an enclosed 2 car garage. The front building will be set back 15-feet in lieu of the required 30- foot setback established through building line ordinance # 46358, to allow a driveway for the 4 garages. ZA-2018-1173-ZAA, ENV-2018-1174-CE. The Committee voted to support the project.
  - **Proposed Motion**: The LUC recommends that the Board of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council support the proposed 15-foot front yard setback in lieu of the required 30 foot setback at 4817 W. Elmwood Ave.
- **D.** 4653, 4653 ½, 4655, 4657 Beverly Blvd: (Discussion and Possible Action) (Tari Kuvhenguhwa, Eddie Navarrette)
  - A CUB to allow the Zone Change for the sale and dispensing of a full line of alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption in conjunction with an existing 2,322 sq. ft. restaurant with 48 indoor seats and with hours of operation from 8:00 am to 1:00 am daily. ZA-2018-1943 CUB, ENV-2018-1944-CE. The Committee voted to oppose the project because the presenters did not appear. **Proposed Motion**: The LUC recommends that the Board of the Greater Wilshire Neighborhood Council oppose the application at 4653, 4653 ½, 4655, 4657 Beverly Blvd. until presented by the applicant.
- **E. Brookside Proposed Zone Change:** (Discussion and Possible Action) (Samantha Karim and Jan Wieringa)
  - Lengthy neighborhood discussion on the pros and cons of the R1-V3-RG vs the R1-R3-RG or the split version proposals. After failing to support the single R1-V3-RG zone on a tie vote, the committee voted to support the two variation zones, as recommended by the Planning Commission, by a narrow margin.
